Interactive Fountain	Water feature with jets rising at different times and heights throughout the summer months.	Positioned centrally within Bachelors Acre park, Windsor	The Acre dates back to the middle ages and includes part of the original Acre Grave Yard. The area was refurbished in 1988 when the water feature was introduced.	
War Memorial	Clewer War Memorial	Clewer, Recreation Ground, Dedworth Road, Windsor	War memorial listing those who were killed during the First and Second World Wars and subsequent actions.	
Lych Gate	Lych Gate - Former entrance to park	Clewer Memorial Recreation Ground, Dedworth Road, Windsor	The lychgate came from the Church of the Saviour which was situated in nearby Bier Lane. This is all that remains of the church as this has since been demolished. It is used as the pedestrian entrance to Clewer Memorial Recreation Ground	
The Dyson Memorial	Drinking fountain commemorating Alderman Thomas Dyson	Western end of Alexandra Gardens, Goswell Road Windsor	Memorial, in the form of a drinking fountain, commemorated Thomas Dyson who founded Dyson & Sons, Pianoforte dealers in Thames Street in 1885 and became Mayor in 1890. This Alderman actively promoted improvements to the town such as getting the Windsor Promenade (this stretch) opened to public. Erected in 1908. Moved from Junction of Goswell Road & Barry Avenue in 2009

<p>Guildhall</p>	<p>Grade 1 Listed Building</p>	<p>High Street, Windsor</p>	<p>Started in 1687 by the legendary architect Sir Thomas Fitz but he died before the building was finished. The building was finished by Sir Christopher Wren. The Guildhall served as the administrative centre of the Town for the common people. It is still used as a civil building. In 2011 it became the home of the Windsor & Royal Borough Museum</p>	
<p>Drinking fountain</p>	<p>Drinking fountain</p>	<p>North side of Guildhall, High Street, Windsor</p>	<p>This Drinking fountain was erected in 1878 and refurbished to commemorate Queen Elizabeth II Silver Jubilee in 1977 in conjunction with the Heritage Society.</p>	
<p>King George V Fountain</p>	<p>Public Memorial & Fountain</p>	<p>Junction of Thames Street and Datchet Road, Windsor</p>	<p>Designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens in Portland Stone. Land given to the people of Windsor by King Edward VII in 1936 with the official opening on St George's day 23rd April 1937. Funded by public conscription.</p>	
<p>Obelisk</p>	<p>50th Year Commemorative Obelisk</p>	<p>Positioned at the Eastern end of the Bachelors Acre park, Windsor</p>	<p>Erected 1809/10 to commemorate 50th year reign of George III. This event was celebrated with Ox roast and eating of plum puddings. Subsequent events have also been noted on the memorial such as an Ox roast in 2002.</p>

Prince Christian Statue	Memorial to Prince Christian Victor	Thames Street, Windsor (on a corner near Theatre Royal)	Commemorates Prince Christian a member of the royal family and one of Queen Victoria's grandsons. He is noted to have been one of the bravest royal soldiers. He died from Enteric Fever in Pretoria on 29th October 1900 aged 33 and is interred in the Pretoria Cemetery	
Queen Victoria Statue	Statue erected to commemorate Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee	Top of Peascod Street, junction High Street & Thames Street, Windsor	The statue was designed and constructed by Sir Edgar Boehm. It was erected in 1887 in celebration of Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee.	
War Memorial	Windsor Parish Church War Memorial	Sheet Street, Windsor	The memorial is situated on the front Eastern side of St John the Baptist. The memorial was erected in memory of parishioners who were killed during first and second World Wars and subsequent actions	
Clock	Seiko Clock	Coach Park, Alexander Gardens, Windsor	Donated by Seiko in early 1980s – linked with Coach Park development	
Clock	Pavement clock	Thames Street, Windsor (Close to WH Smith & McDonalds)	The original clock was installed on May 15, 1950, by former Windsor Mayor and owner of Dysons, Sir Cyril Dyson. This went missing for some years and a new clock was installed in April 2011. The landmark also has a hidden feature as just before the clock was lowered into place a time capsule was put into the ground below the clock

Fountain	Jubilee Fountain	The Goswells, Goswells Road, Windsor	Installed and opened for 4th June 2012 for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee.	
Hurricane Airplane	Replica Hurricane	The Promenade, Barry Avenue, Windsor (Western end by Arches)	A replica Hurricane erected in and unveiled on 20th July 2012 by the Mayor of the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead, Councillor Colin Rayner. The aircraft bears the markings of an actual aircraft flown in the Battle of Britain by Squadron Leader John Grandy who, as Marshal of the Royal Air Force Sir John Grandy GCB GCVO KBE DSO KStJ, was Constable and Governor of Windsor Castle from 1978-88.	
War Memorial	War Memorial	Nell Gwynn Gardens, Ascot	Plaque reads - Rural District Council of Windsor – Kingswick Gardens, these gardens were dedicated to those who fell in World War I & II, Adjoining housing scheme at Nell Gwynne Avenue designed b Messrs Sainsbury & Chamberlain Chartered Architects of Reading & Built by Messers Wells (Old Windsor) Ltd was awarded the 1953 Housing Medal and Diploma of the Ministry of Housing & Local Government for the Southern Region	

Other features in Windsor include the Chequer Board at Church Street Gardens, the Maze at the Goswells, the Sundial at Alexandra Gardens and the War Memorial on the Corner of Goswells Road and Barry Avenue

The Ada Lewis Memorial	Water Trough	Bridge Gardens, Ray Mead Road, Maidenhead	<p>The Ada Lewis Trough erected November 1908 in memory of local benefactor Ada Lewis and was used as a drinking trough. It was relocated in the 1970s from its position on the southern Maidenhead side of the bridge to the northern side on the edge of Bridge Gardens, and was no longer functioning as a trough. It was relocated in 2010 within Bridge Gardens as part of a water feature. The illuminated fountain sits within a pool and is surrounded by a paved area with seating.</p>

Steel screen/arch with lights, paving and planting.</p> <p>Developed in partnership with Sustrans routes being added, the National Cycle Network and the Millennium Commission with the involvement of local people plus Altwood School, Larchfield Primary School and The Brunel Centre.</p>	
Fountain	Originally a Drinking Fountain	Grenfell Park, Grenfell Road, Maidenhead	<p>The fountain was presented in memory of Elizabeth Cholmondeley, late of Hurley. Restored and incorporated into a new decorative fountain/ water feature (non drinking) in 2009</p>	
Cannon	Replica Cannon	Grenfell Park, Grenfell Road, Maidenhead	<p>New in 2009, replacing long lost cannon, which was in the park until 1970's</p>

The bridge was rescued by the Maidenhead Civic Society in 1976 and was last renovated in 1997. Bridge is closed each year during bird nesting season to prevent access to island to encourage bird nesting etc.	
Boathouse Spire Shelter	Shelter	Guards Club Park to Thames Island, Old Acres, Maidenhead	The spire to the former club boathouse now covers the shelter in the park.	
Kulture Wall	Feature Wall	Adjacent to the Magnet Leisure Centre Maidenhead	Public Art Feature Art proposed and developed by then Director of Norden Farm Centre for the Arts – David Hill, as an ICON Project by an Artist (2001)	
Clock Tower	Memorial	King Street, Maidenhead (island between dual carriageway opposite main railway station entrance_	“Erected to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria who on June 20th 1897 completed the sixtieth year of a reign unparalleled for progress in progress in all that makes for the happiness of the human race. God Bless the Queen” The Memorial was subscribed for by the public during the Mayoralty of William Grenfell, High Steward of the Borough of Maidenhead. Foundation stone laid 1899 (7th Nov)

A memorial plaque is fixed to the wall on the northern edge of garden.</p>	
Statue of Sir Nicholas Winton	Statue	Platform 3 at Maidenhead Train Station	Statue installed in 2010 as memorial to Sir Nicholas Winton from Maidenhead who organised a total of eight trains from Prague to London, and helped find foster families for the refugees.
